If you have visited our school's Top Playground as of late, you may have noticed our 'Very Hungry Caterpillar' mural slowly taking shape. The mural project was made possible through the acquisition of the '2015 Social Change Through Creativity Grant Program' sponsored by Fairfield City Council through our school's CLO Denise Bugeja.

The project was facilitated by ceramic artists Natalie Valiente and Kathie Raco from the 'Hands of Clay' studio at Casula. Running over four weeks, the workshops included students (all 12 classes), parents and community members. The project is reflective of the strong ties the school has with the broader community and our inclusive culture.

In the mural, students have re-created images from Eric Carle's "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" story. Now that it is completed, students will be able to walk around the top playground and recount the story.

The Mural was officially inaugurated on Friday, 4 December 2015 with the artists and Gary Paramanathan, representing Fairfield Council, as well as our students and broader school community.


I wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a happy and safe holiday. I will see everyone back on deck next year with some new and exciting adventures.
